Teeth Whitening



What is Teeth Whitening?

Do you dream of having a smile free of stains and discoloration? Would you love to see a stunning smile every time you look in the mirror? **With teeth whitening at Legacy Dental, you can brighten the shade of your teeth and remove stains in a single visit.**

There are a number of reasons why you might get your teeth whitened. Everyone is different; and just as our hair and skin color vary, so do our teeth. Very few people have naturally brilliant-white teeth. Our teeth also become more discolored as we get older.

Your teeth may become stained on the surface from certain food and drinks. Smoking is another common cause of stained teeth. Calculus or tartar can also affect the coloring of your teeth. Some people may have staining under the surface, which can be caused by certain antibiotics or by tiny cracks in the teeth which naturally take up stains.

Tooth whitening can be a very effective way of lightening the natural color of your teeth without removing any of the tooth surface. It cannot make a complete color change, but it can lighten the existing shade to give you that brighter, white smile you want.

As one of the most common cosmetic dental procedures, teeth whitening or bleaching, is the process of removing stains from your teeth and making them lighter. Teeth whitening can be completed by polishing the teeth or through a procedure called micro-abrasion. Teeth whitening may also be accomplished by applying gentle and safe whitening agents to the teeth. The active ingredient in the whitening product is usually hydrogen peroxide or carbamide peroxide. As the active ingredient is broken down, oxygen gets into the enamel on the teeth and the tooth color is made lighter. **Our dentists can help you decide upon the best method to get the results you desire.**

How Long does Teeth Whitening Last?


The results of whitening will last **one to two years**, and in some cases up to three years. How long it lasts will depend, at least in part, on your diet and how many acidic or staining foods and beverages you consume. The great thing is that if you go through our office for bleaching, we can provide you with whitening gel to touch up your smile as needed.

Does Teeth Whitening Hurt?

One of the common side effects of bleaching is **tooth sensitivity**. However, it is reversible. It is also possible to experience slight discomfort in the gums, or white patches on the gum line. **These symptoms are also temporary and should disappear within a few days of the treatment finishing.** We will decide on the best ways to help prevent sensitivity, or at least minimize it, prior to beginning the whitening process and effectively treat any other issues that may possibly arise.

Is Teeth Whitening Safe?

Yes. In fact, while whitening you are less likely to get decay and gum disease. However, as mentioned before, it can cause temporary tooth sensitivity for some patients



How is Teeth Whitening Performed?

There are varying options when it comes to whitening your teeth. Thus, you'll be able to select the method that is the most appropriate fit for you given your unique situation. Options to consider include:

Micro-Abrasion involves applying a special material onto your tooth surface, and then gently removing the stained layer and discoloration away from your tooth. The teeth are then polished, cleaned and rinsed. This treatment is effective for patients with spots or stains on teeth that make the teeth appear multi-colored.

In-Office Bleaching encompasses a one-hour visit in our office. By utilizing this method, we can avoid sensitivity and accomplish the same amount of whitening in 1 hour as you would accomplish in 2 weeks of at-home whitening. During this procedure, we'll apply a rubber shield or gel onto your gums to protect them. Then we'll apply the whitening agent to your teeth using a specially made tray which fits into your mouth like a mouthguard. Most people notice that their teeth whiten 4-6 shades and are even lighter the following day. This is different than most other in-office whitening procedures where the teeth are usually darker the next day as they rehydrate.

At-Home Bleaching uses custom-made whitening trays that are fabricated using impressions of your teeth. You will then perform the whitening treatment at home using a gel-like agent. How often and for how long you wear the trays will be decided in consultation with your doctor.

At-Home Whitening Kits are also available as over-the-counter products. This is the most economical method. We offer a product called Opalescence Go.

When choosing a provider to whiten your teeth, there are several important factors to consider. Given the significance of this procedure to the aesthetics of your smile, you'll want to ensure you find the right fit for your situation. As part of that process, consider the following:

- **Legacy Dental offers an in-office whitening system that is designed to be more effective** (reaching 100% of your teeth's treatment area!), while also making your comfort a top priority.
- Additionally, **Legacy Dental offers several other modalities of teeth whitening in order to find the best fit given your objectives, budget and unique situation.** For example, we offer 'microabrasion', a treatment you cannot find at day spas or medical offices, which is able to replace stains or discoloration resulting from previous dental work.
- **Our in-office treatments are supervised by a dentist, which leads to a safer and more effective treatment process.** Our dentists will have a discussion with you upfront in order to set realistic expectations, including when whitening may not achieve the desired outcomes and/or when other treatments (like bonding or veneers) should be considered instead.



Is Teeth Whitening Affordable?

There is a wide range in teeth whitening pricing depending upon the type of treatment that is performed. In some cases, insurance may cover a portion of this cost for you. However, it is usually considered non-medically necessary, and therefore an out-of-pocket cost.

What are Alternatives to Teeth Whitening?

If teeth whitening does not appear to be the right solution for you, there are other ways to achieve a brighter, whiter smile. These include **tooth bonding, porcelain veneers, Lumineers (also known as ceramic veneers), and/or dental crowns.** In addition, you can improve the appearance of your smile through simple everyday lifestyle changes, which may include a change in dietary habits, abstaining from smoking and/or tobacco use, occasionally brushing with baking soda and hydrogen peroxide, and, most importantly, maintaining excellent oral hygiene. Our doctors will be happy to discuss these alternatives with you and find the right fit.



Dental Crowns

What are Dental Crowns?

When your tooth becomes cracked, broken, or damaged due to trauma or decay, a dental crown is often the ideal solution. This common restoration offers both functional and cosmetic benefits to your smile.

A dental crown is similar to a cap, which is custom-made to protect your damaged tooth. Using modern technology, your state-of-the-art crown is custom designed to the desired shape to fit comfortably onto your tooth and integrate with the rest of your bite, and also with the exact shade to seamlessly match the rest of your smile.

Dental crowns are effective for a wide range of treatments, which may include strengthening a tooth that has a large and/or older filling, repairing a damaged tooth, serving as an anchor for a bridge, helping improve the aesthetics of your smile by repairing misshaped teeth, fixing a tooth that has been cracked or worn down, and/or protecting a tooth that had undergone a root canal.

How Long do Dental Crowns Last?

Professionally-fitted dental crowns usually have about **5 to 15 years of longevity** on average. Crowns are made of resilient materials, like porcelain or metal alloys, which allow them to stand up to a lot of potential wear and damage. While it is not guaranteed your crown will last forever, proper care for it can keep it pearly white for several years, and there are some simple steps that can be taken to extend a crown's life. For example, proper brushing and flossing, avoidance of grinding your teeth (or using a mouthguard at night if you do), and using caution when chewing on hard objects. Consistently seeing a dentist for **scheduled dental checkups and cleanings is also an important factor in a crown's longevity.** Dentists have the tools necessary to care both for natural teeth and dental crowns. Regular cleanings help to ward off any new infections that could develop in the mouth and spread, endangering both the crown and the tooth beneath it.



Do Dental Crowns Hurt?

The placement of a dental crown should be a pain free experience. Your complete comfort is of utmost importance to our entire team. During the procedure, **we will use a numbing jelly and local anesthetic**, and you should not feel any sensations beyond what you would feel from a typical filling. In other words, nothing more than gentle vibrations and small amounts of pressure. We also **offer sedation dentistry**, if you prefer, to ensure the procedure is entirely comfortable for you without any concern.

Are Dental Crowns Safe?

Dental crowns are generally safe. While there is always a risk for some level of complication with any procedure, they are rare and usually minor. The most common risks include an allergic reaction to the crown or anesthetic, an infection in the tooth, or sensitivity to heat or cold in the affected tooth. Be sure to communicate to our team if you have any allergies (especially metal allergies). At Legacy Dental, your care and comfort are our top priorities. We take every step possible to ensure the safest and highest quality care is delivered to you. **Before any procedure, we'll work with you to better understand any potential risks and ensure you feel you're making the right decision for you.**



How are Dental Crowns Placed?

First Appointment - At your first appointment, we'll have a consultation together to determine your wants and needs. Together, we can discuss the options you might consider and decide whether a dental crown is the right fit for your situation. If so, we will then proceed by taking impressions of your damaged tooth (or teeth). These impressions are then sent to our lab for design and creation. Before you leave our office, we may place a temporary crown to protect your tooth until the permanent crown is ready for placement.

Second Appointment – Once the permanent crown is completed and received back from our lab, which is generally within a two-week period, then you'll come in for a second appointment to have it placed. At this time, we remove the temporary crown (if one was placed) and replace it with the permanent crown, which is then bonded into place.

CEREC One-Visit Crowns - Please note that if your crown is urgent and/or you are time restricted, we may recommend a CEREC One-Visit Crown. Using CEREC technology, you can be in and out of our office with a permanent, all ceramic crown in just one visit! Using the latest CAD/CAM (computer-aided design and manufacturing) technology, we can design, create, and place a crown right here in our office within the same visit. During the procedure, an optical image is taken of the prepared tooth, and a three-dimensional virtual restoration is designed and sent to our milling machine. The machine then creates your custom crown, ready for placement, within only 20 minutes!

Post-Treatment Care - The recovery period after the placement of a dental crown is typically only a few days, if any at all. Patients may experience minor inflammation, sensitivity or irritation following the procedure that should well subside within a week or so. Warm salt water rinses a few times a day are recommended to help reduce any swelling of the gums. Any pain issues should be easily managed with over-the-counter medications.

Since we work with multiple labs and modalities, together we can help choose the longest-lasting and best-looking option for you.
- Our doctors put significant effort towards ensuring your **provisional / temporary crowns look nearly as nice as the final restoration**. That means no more awkward smiles and lack of confidence while waiting for the permanent solution to be placed.

Veneers



What is a Veneer?

A veneer is a custom-made ceramic or porcelain facing that is bonded onto a tooth. It can make a tooth look whiter and cover up common imperfections. It can also change the shape or alignment of a tooth, and may also be used to treat worn or crooked teeth. Veneers provide a comprehensive and flexible solution to creating the smile of your dreams. Given they can solve for nearly every cosmetic imperfection, you'll be able to have a perfect looking smile once treatment is completed.

How Long do Veneers Last?

Veneers are among the longest lasting restorations in dentistry and are fairly easy to maintain. **Most studies have found that they will last 10-20 years.** We have seen many cases that have lasted much longer. How long they last will largely depend on how you take care of them. The most common cause for the premature failure of a veneer is clenching or grinding your teeth. If you are prone to this condition and are considering veneers, a nightguard may be recommended.



Do Veneers Hurt?

The treatment process is very comfortable from start to finish. Most times teeth require minimal preparation or no preparation. If desired, however, you can choose to be sedated for any necessary tooth preparation.

Are Veneers Safe?

The best dental treatment is usually the most conservative dental treatment. Veneers are more conservative than crowns, but not as conservative as orthodontic treatment (if straightening your smile is the primary objective). Together we can help you better understand any potential risks and make the right decision for you.


How are Veneers Placed?

First Appointment - To begin, we'll have a consultation together to determine your exact wants and needs. We'll take impressions or models and also take some photographs of your teeth.

Second Appointment - Your teeth are lightly prepared so that the veneers do not appear bulky and blend in naturally with your smile. Temporary veneers are placed that mimic the planned size, shape, and color of the new veneers.

Third Appointment - We will evaluate your comfort, function, and satisfaction with the temporary veneers. This often skipped-step helps us make sure that your new smile is just what you want.

Final Appointment - The temporary veneers are removed and replaced by the final veneers. Once approved these will be bonded into place. Now all you have to do is smile! Generally, the entire veneer process takes **3-4 weeks from start to finish**.

Dental Implants



What are Dental Implants?

Dental implants are used to replace missing teeth and restore the beauty and function of your smile. A dental implant will blend seamlessly with your natural teeth so that no one will notice. Further, they are an effective way to replace missing teeth without damaging your other teeth.

In fact, implants prevent bone loss, which is caused by missing teeth, and this can also prevent premature aging. In addition, replacing a missing tooth will ensure you avoid other issues like adjacent teeth shifting or development of discomfort in your bite.

An implant involves placing a titanium screw that is carefully inserted into the jawbone. It is then used to support a single permanent restoration, or a denture, or an entire mouth of new beautiful permanent teeth. Dental implants can look very natural and function like your real teeth. How Long do Dental Implants Last?

With proper care, your dental implant post should last your lifetime. Dental implants do not get cavities and are less susceptible to gum disease. Therefore, dental implants should last longer than any other dental treatment your dentist may provide. In less than 5% of cases, the initial implant placed does not heal properly and requires replacement. Once the bone has healed around the implant, they are very durable. Eventually, the teeth attached to the implant will need replacing, but one should expect at least five years of service from the attached teeth.

Do Dental Implants Hurt?

The placement of a dental implant should be a pain free experience. Your complete comfort is of utmost importance to our entire team. During the procedure, **we will use a local anesthetic**, and all you should feel is gentle vibration and a small amount of pressure. We also **offer sedation dentistry**, if you prefer, to ensure the procedure is entirely comfortable for you without any concern. Most patients report not needing to take any pain medication after the procedure and that the level of discomfort is not much different than other minor dental procedures. Once the dental implant has healed, it should feel like any other healthy tooth.

Are Dental Implants Safe?

Dental implants are made from the same materials as most hip and knee replacements. Titanium is among the most biocompatible materials that exist. There are some risks associated with dental implants (such as infections, nerve damage, tissue damage, and/or gum recession), but in the hands of an experienced dentist, those risks are minimal. The dentists at Legacy Dental have placed and restored hundreds of dental implants and taken many hours of continuing education in implant dentistry.





How are Dental Implants Placed?

First Appointment - At your first appointment, we'll have a consultation together to determine your wants and needs. Together, we can discuss the options you might consider for tooth replacement. We can then move forward with planning the specifics of your care. We'll take a 3D x-ray and digital scan of your teeth. This will allow us to evaluate the exact amount of bone available and plan the exact position of the dental implant.


Second Appointment - At this next appointment, your dental implants are placed. Some patients choose sedation dentistry for this visit. However, the placement of the dental implant feels similar to other routine dental procedures, and many prefer only local anesthetic. Often a tooth or denture is placed on the dental implant immediately after it has been placed.

Post-Treatment Care - The dental implant is then allowed to heal for a few months. After that, final impressions are made, and the permanent teeth or dentures are fabricated and attached to the dental implants. **Generally, the entire implant process takes 3-6 months from start to finish.**


What are Dentures?

Dentures are artificial teeth and gums that are formed to your mouth and created by your dentists to replace lost or removed natural teeth. Dentures can either be full or partial, meaning they can either replace all teeth on either the top or bottom gum line, or just a few that are missing. Regardless of what kind of dentures you may need, they will be custom designed to fit your mouth, and visually matched to your existing teeth.

Dentures not only improve the appearance of a smile that has multiple missing teeth, but they also keep the structure of the mouth sound by supporting the structures around the cheeks and lips. Dentures also make it possible to eat foods that require chewing, making it possible to keep your diet the same and ensure that you are properly nourished. Lastly, dentures are a viable solution to replace teeth that are causing serious pain and oral health issues, such as those with rotted roots or severe damage. Having dentures fitted means that troublesome teeth are eliminated and replaced with a strong and beautiful alternative.

How Long do Dentures Last?

With proper care, a denture should last for at least five years, but most times dentures will last many years longer than that. Often, dentures can be relined or refitted, and their life extended. To make sure your denture lasts as long as possible, you should 1) have an exam performed each year to check your bone, gums, bite, and the denture, 2) never adjust the denture yourself, 3) be careful not to drop your dentures, especially in the sink as the hard porcelain can chip or break your dentures, 4) clean your dentures regularly, following our recommendations and avoiding harsh chemicals or abrasives, and 5) keep your dentures away from pets (dogs, especially, love to use dentures as chew toys).




Do Dentures Hurt?

If the denture does not fit correctly (i.e., the bite is incorrect), the denture can rub on the gums when chewing and cause a sore spot. However, as long as the dentures are made correctly, the bite should be able to be adjusted to address the concern. This is why it's important that you and your dentist communicate clearly about the fit during the denture making process. **At Legacy Dental, we are committed to making your dentures fit comfortably and feel like your natural teeth!**

Are Dentures Safe?

Yes, dentures are generally very safe. The biggest concern is inflammation and/or infection resulting from poor-fitting dentures, which can rub on sensitive gums and cause sore spots. Therefore, **ensuring a correctly fitting denture is quite important**, not just for comfort, but for your general health. However, with proper cleaning and regular dental appointments, most patients won't experience any infection, inflammation or dental ailments.



How are Dentures Placed?

The first step is to have a thorough exam completed to see if you are a qualified candidate for dentures. Many patients believe that dentures are their only option. However, there are other options available. So, it's important we first determine if dentures are the right fit based upon your unique needs and desires. Before placing dentures, it is essential to evaluate the bone and the gums where the denture will rest. If there are bumps, ridges, or swollen and/or irritated tissue, those areas must be corrected to allow the denture to fit well.

Following an exam, **impressions, or molds, are made.** A second appointment is sometimes necessary to take a second impression or mold with a custom-fabricated tray (i.e., what holds the impression material). Some patients do have trouble with gagging during impression-making process. We have training in techniques to make this step more comfortable, including sedation dentistry, acupuncture, and use of the gate-control theory (distraction). An accurate impression is the most important step of making a denture. A denture can only fit as well as the impression.

Following an accurate impression, an appointment is made to record the bite, choose the color or shade of the teeth, and discuss the tooth shape and position. Leveraging the latest technology, we'll help you choose the desired look and feel of your new teeth. This ensures the dentures will be fabricated exactly to your liking, and that they'll not only be comfortable, but will look great when placed.

A third appointment is then made to try-on the denture. At this stage, the denture is made from a wax material. This allows for changes to the position of the teeth and the bite. Taking this step helps to make sure that everything done in the second step was correct. If not, additional appointments will be made to get things perfect, and until you are 100% happy with the appearance and fit

The next step is to place or deliver the dentures. At this point, we will double-check the fit and the bite and make any adjustments. Studies suggest as many as 50% of dentures wearers do not regularly wear their dentures due to inappropriate fit. That is why we are so focused on ensuring the correct fit for you!


Finally, we generally like to see our denture patients every week until everything is fitting and feeling perfect. This can take one to ten more visits and is included in the fees for the fabrication of the denture.

Usually, the entire process to make dentures takes about three weeks. Often times, a temporary partial denture (called a flipper), which replaces one or several teeth, can be made the same day (or within 24 hours), so that you have an interim solution while waiting for your permanent denture. **We can also complete the entire denture process more quickly if needed and have even made dentures in just 24 hours.** This expedited service carries an additional fee of course.

What is an Implant Retained Denture?

While traditional dentures are a viable solution for many, it's no secret they have their issues. They can become loose, uncomfortable, and shift around while you eat, talk and/or smile. That's why we offer an alternative restoration. With implant retained dentures, you don't have to worry about slippage or accidents. **Implant-retained dentures use two to six dental implants to secure the full arch of teeth within your mouth**, and that leads to several positive improvements over traditional dentures – namely better security and stability, improved eating function, a more natural appearance, increased comfort, and enhanced jawbone preservation (which benefits your oral health and prevents premature aging). With implant retained dentures, you'll be able to eat your favorite foods again, speak more clearly, gain a boost in confidence, and improve your overall quality of life.

How Long do Implant Retained Dentures Last?

Implants have the ability to last a lifetime with proper care and maintenance. Your denture, however, will likely need to be replaced at some point. The good news though is that **implant retained dentures are much sturdier and more durable than traditional dentures, and therefore, typically last much longer**. With regular wear and tear on the porcelain, you should expect to replace the denture portion of your implant retained denture every **ten to fifteen years**. The nylon O-rings will wear out more quickly, though, and probably need to be replaced every two to three years.





Are Implant Retained Dentures Safe?

Yes, implant retained dentures are generally safe. In fact, they address the biggest concern that is prevalent among those who wear traditional dentures. With traditional dentures, a poor fit can lead to rubbing on sensitive gums, which may develop into sore spots, and that puts the patient at an increased risk for inflammation and/or infection. However, implant retained dentures create higher stability, fit and function given they are supported in your jawbone via titanium implant screws.

With that said, it is possible for dental implants to cause complications during surgical placement. These risks include infections, nerve damage, tissue damage, and/or gum recession. No surgical procedure is completely without risk. How are Implant Retained Dentures Placed?

First - You'll meet with one of our implant dentists for a consultation. During this time, we'll go over all of your treatment options and determine if implant retained dentures are the right for you and your unique situation. If you decide to proceed with implant retained dentures, we'll conduct a thorough exam to ensure you don't have any oral health problems that need to be taken care of first (such as gum disease). We'll then take a 3D digital image of your mouth with cone-beam computed tomography technology. This captures your gums, bone, tissues, and nerves to help us determine the best place for your implants. We'll also take an impression and photos to design your custom-made denture. You and your dentist can discuss the smile style you'd like, including the shade of white and tooth shape.

Second - Once your custom denture is fabricated, we'll have you come back to try it on and make sure it looks beautiful, fits comfortably, and functions harmoniously with your bite. We'll also place your new dental implants and remove any teeth that require removal. It will take an average of three months for the posts and bone to heal. So, during this time, you'll wear your newly fabricated denture - just not secured to the implants until they're healed.

Third - Following three months of healing (on average), we'll uncover your implants and make any adjustments to your denture as needed. Finally, we'll attach your new denture to your implants. Once you and your dentist are happy with the result, your new smile will be ready to show off!

Generally, the entire implant retained denture process takes four months from start to finish.

Dental Bridges

What are Dental Bridges?

A dental bridge, or a partial fixed denture, is used to replace lost or missing teeth. This may involve teeth that soon need to be extracted, or teeth that were previously lost. Bridges can be used to replace just one single tooth, or may be used to replace multiple consecutively missing teeth. Replacing missing teeth is important for several reasons, which includes restoring the aesthetics of your smile, maintaining the ability to properly chew and speak, maintaining the shape of your face, distributing the forces in your bite properly, and preventing your teeth from drifting out of position.

A dental bridge requires healthy surrounding teeth or the placement of dental implants for support. **The bridge holds prosthetic teeth, and then uses the adjacent teeth as support to maintain the bridge in place.** A dental crown may also be used to reinforce the structure of the supporting teeth if natural teeth are being used, and their integrity is in question. A dental bridge can also be secured using a dental implant to avoid compromising the integrity of existing teeth.

How Long do Dental Bridges Last?

Bridges can last **at least five to seven years.** With good oral hygiene and regular professional cleanings, the bridge may last more than ten years. The success of the dental bridge partially depends on the health and strength of the remaining teeth. With a bridge, it's also especially important to prevent tooth decay and gum disease that can lead to tooth loss. For proper tooth and gum care, you should brush and floss twice per day, get regular professional cleanings, and eat a balanced diet.




Do Dental Bridges Hurt?

The placement of a dental bridge should be a pain free experience. Your complete comfort is of utmost importance to our entire team. During the procedure, **we will use a numbing jelly and local anesthetic**, and you should not feel any sensations beyond what you would feel from a typical filling. In other words, nothing more than gentle vibrations and small amounts of pressure. We also **offer sedation dentistry**, if you prefer, to ensure the procedure is entirely comfortable for you without any concern.

Are Dental Bridges Safe?

While there is always a risk for some level of complication with any procedure, **the placement of a dental bridge is generally considered quite safe, and there are rarely any complications.** There are, however, some concerns to be aware of with the longer-term function of a dental bridge. For example, an ill-fitting bridge can cause decay of the tooth under the crown. There is also a possibility for reduction of the structures of natural healthy teeth to accommodate the appliance in place. And the restoration can collapse if the supporting teeth are not strong enough. It is therefore important that these risks are properly assessed during your consultation, and a bridge is only placed if the conditions are supportive. At Legacy Dental, your care and comfort are our top priorities. **We take every step possible to ensure the safest and highest quality care is delivered to you.** Before any procedure, we'll work with you to better understand any potential risks and ensure you feel you're making the right decision for you.



How are Dental Bridges Placed?

First Appointment - During your first visit, the dentist will reshape the abutment teeth (i.e., remove part of the enamel and dentin) to ensure there is proper room for a crown to be placed over them. Next, impressions of the teeth are made, which serve as a model from which the bridge, pontic, and crowns will be made by our lab. Your dentist will make a temporary bridge to wear to protect the exposed teeth and gums while the bridge is being made.

Second Appointment - During your second visit, your temporary bridge will be removed and the new porcelain or metal bridge will be checked and adjusted, as necessary, to achieve a proper fit. Multiple visits may be required to check the fit of the metal framework and bite. This is dependent on each individual's case. If the dental bridge is a fixed bridge, the dentist may temporarily cement it in place for a couple of weeks to make sure it is fitting properly. After a couple weeks, the bridge is cemented into place. **Generally, the entire bridge process takes 2-4 weeks from start to finish.**





